

ORDINANCE NO. 2013-1

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF REPUBLIC, WASHINGTON, AMENDING SECTIONS 10.12.050 AND 10.12.060 OF THE REPUBLIC MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING PARKING OF VEHICLES ON CITY STREETS WITHIN THE CITY OF REPUBLIC.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Republic, Washington, has determined that it is in the best interest of the city residents and the public at large to amend the Republic Municipal Code to limit or restrict parking on certain city streets within the city.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Republic, Washington, do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1 - AMENDMENT.

A. SECTION 10.12.050 of the Republic Municipal Code, which reads as follows:

Parking prohibited during certain hours. No vehicle shall park for a period of longer than two consecutive hours between the hours of nine a.m. and six p.m. on the following designated streets, avenues, or portions thereof:

A. Clark Avenue from Klondike Road to Eighth Street and from Eighth Street to Ninth Street on the east side of Clark Avenue only, including SR 20 from Sixth Street to Eighth Street;

B. Sixth Street, Seventh Street, and Eighth Street between Clark Avenue and Keller Street;

C. Delaware Avenue between Keller Street and Kean Street;

D. The north side and the south side of Delaware Avenue, Sixth Street and Seventh Street from Kean Street East to Keller Street.

be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

10.12.050 Parking prohibited during certain hours. No vehicle shall park for a period of longer than two consecutive hours between the hours of nine a.m. and six p.m. on the following designed streets, avenues, or portions thereof:

Those present: Same as Workshop.

Guests: Same as Workshop.

Mayor Pro Tempe Michel called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Larry Heming motioned to approve the consent agenda. Loni Simone seconded; motion carried.

Larry Heming motioned to have Bob Kirkham inspect 663 S Adams St before sending a letter to owner. Loni Simone seconded; motion carried.

Loni Simone motioned for Joy Culp to attend the Bias conference in February. Leo Jenkins seconded; motion carried.

Larry Heming motioned to pass Ordinance 2013-01 for parking violations. Jenkins seconded; motion carried.

Larry Heming motioned to approve council meetings; January 21, 2013, February 18, 2013, and Sept 2, 2013 be moved from that Monday night to the Tuesday night after the holidays. Loni Simone seconded; motion carried.

Leo Jenkins motioned to start having all meetings recorded for website. Larry Heming seconded; motion carried.




Larry Heming motioned to adjourn the meeting. Loni Simone seconded; motion carried.

A. Clark Avenue from Klondike Road to Eighth Street, and including SR 20 from Sixth Street to Eighth Street; *provided*, that this parking restriction shall not apply to the residents of adjacent multi-family residential units parking on the west side of Clark Avenue from Eighth Street to Ninth Street.

B. Sixth Street, Seventh Street, and Eighth Street between Clark Avenue and Keller Street;

C. Delaware Avenue between Keller Street and Kean Street; and

D. The north side and south side of Delaware Avenue, Sixth Street and Seventh Street from Kean Street East to Keller Street.

B. SECTION 10.12.060 of the Republic Municipal Code which reads as follows:

10.12.060 Sign posting.

Any parking areas described in Sections 10.12.020 through 10.12.040 of this chapter shall be clearly marked and signs posted designating such areas and parking restrictions.

Any vehicle found to be left in a restricted parking area as designated in Sections 10.12.010 through 10.12.040 of this chapter for a period of twenty-four (24) consecutive hours may be removed by the city of Republic, and all expenses incurred in such removal and/or storage shall be the sole responsibility of the owner of the vehicle.

be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

10.12.060 Sign posting and removal of vehicles in violation.

Any parking areas described in Sections 10.12.020 through 10.12.050 of this chapter shall be clearly marked and signs posted designating such areas and parking restrictions.

Any vehicle found to be left in a restricted parking area as designated in Sections 10.12.020 through 10.12.050 of this chapter for a period of twelve (12) hours continuously within such designated restricted parking areas may be removed by the city of Republic, and all expenses incurred in such removal and/or storage shall be the sole responsibility of the owner of the vehicle. For the purposes of

this section "continuously within such designated restricted parking areas" shall mean to leave a vehicle within any restricted parking areas as designated in Sections 10.12.020 through 10.12.050 of this chapter, regardless of whether such vehicle has been moved to another location within such restricted parking areas.

SECTION 2 - SEVERABILITY.

If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this ordinance.

SECTION 3 - EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take effect after its passage by the Council, approval by the Mayor and five (5) days after publication as required by law.


