

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-05

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF REPUBLIC, WASHINGTON
AMENDING SECTION 13.04.340(C) OF THE REPUBLIC
MUNICIPAL CODE TO CHANGE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION
OF CHAPTER 13.04 OF THE REPUBLIC MUNICIPAL CODE.**

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Republic, Washington, has determined that it is in the best interests of the residents of the City and the public at large to decriminalize violations of Chapter 13.04 of the Republic Municipal Code relating to water, sewer and solid waste within the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Republic, Washington, do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1 – AMENDMENT

Section 13.04.340(C) of the Republic Municipal Code which reads as follows:

C. Any person found to be guilty of violating any provision of this chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment for a time not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

C. A violation of any provision of this chapter shall be deemed to be a civil infraction, and any person found to be guilty of violating any provision of this chapter shall be assessed a civil penalty of not more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for each offense. Each day that a violation continues shall be deemed to be a separate offense.

Larry Heming motioned to approve the consent agenda. Loni Simone seconded; motion carried.


Leo Jenkins motioned to accept the resignations of Cliff Couse and Alex Wirt from the EMS Board.

Dave Michel seconded; motion carried.


Loni Simone motioned to adjourn the meeting. Dave Michel seconded; motion carried.

SECTION 2 - EFFECTIVE DATE


This Ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage by the Council, approval by the Mayor, and five (5) days after publication as required by law.
